Disinterments Done Right

Disinterments are not the same as interments. There are many steps that need to be taken to ensure a proper, dignified way of performing a disinterment. This session will cover everything you need to know to make sure a disinterment is done in a dignified, legal, and safe way.

- Florida laws and regulations regarding disinterment.
- Processes that should be used to ensure all administrative components are properly executed, such as authorizations and releases.
- Things that you should address and control before a disinterment occurs (Will photos/videos be allowed? Will a new casket or vault be required? etc.)
- Steps to take to ensure the disinterment goes safely and smoothly by utilizing the right equipment and staff.
